#### THE POWER OF HOSPITALITY

by Charles Crismier III

Could an open heart, open hand and open home change our world? How about your family, your church... even your city and our nation?

THERE WAS A TIME when hospitality was at the heart of the American home. There was a time when hearts and homes that practiced hospitality welded families into community with an invisible glue that let people know they belonged and were welcome and accepted. And there was a time twenty centuries ago when one of the hallmarks of the Church was "behold how they love one another." They broke bread together "from house to house with gladness and singleness of heart," and the Church exploded (Acts 2:41-47).

Something dramatic has happened, however, since those times, in our time, in just one generation. So widespread is this change of heart reflected in the closing of our homes that *Christianity Today* (May 22, 2000) asked the headline question, "Whatever Happened to Hospitality?" The writer notes, "For Christians, a lack of hospitality toward strangers has crept into our churches." He laments visiting "dozens of evangelical churches and few have shown hospitality beyond a simple greeting of hello."

There is a growing and pervasive sense throughout our land that hospitality is becoming discouragingly scarce as an art and as an expression of the heart. So let me ask you, Whatever happened to hospitality?

#### ALONE IN A CROWD

The world's population is being funneled rapidly from scattered farms and agrarian country settings to cities and teeming metropolises. This sociological phenomenon has been taking place for a century in America. Faceless people now pass us by the hundreds

without identity or affinity. We connect only of necessity for work or worship and then flee to the haven of home to catch our breath in personal peace, only to repeat the cycle of human anonymity the next day, intent on getting to, through and from work.

Shockingly, 70% of pastors admit they have no friends. Many folk are experiencing what one sociologist called "crowded loneliness"—they are surrounded by people but "lost in the crowd." There is an absence of heart connectedness, a deep feeling that no one knows my name, or even cares. This is true for both men and women. The collective effect is the collapse of all sense of community, a conclusion now validated almost universally by both secular and spiritual sociological observers.

This rapidly growing social development was demonstrated to my wife, Kathie, and me rather dramatically one Sunday afternoon. We had recently moved to a new neighborhood consisting of only two blocks on one street. We had been welcomed only by "Mama Rosa", the self-appointed street captain who knew everything

about everybody anywhere. Since we had for several years given ourselves to hospitality as a way of life, we determined to invite the neighbors for a Christmas open house.

Since I was then practicing law, I prepared an appropriate "subpoena." Kathie and I walked the street, personally serving these subpoenas on our unmet "friends," inviting them to join us. We were pleasantly shocked

when fifty-two responded, insisting upon crowding into our dining room

to revel in a decade-long-sought opportunity for collective fellowship. One couple reported that after seventeen years they had finally met their neighbors as they walked to our home, even though they lived directly across the street

from each other, less than two hundred invited the pastor and his wife for dinner.

But the same patterns persist in our worshiping congregations. In one congregation we attended for several months, the a difference it could make. The next Sunworship service was interrupted weekly for a time of welcoming and greeting in purported hospitality. Almost without exception, we noticed that as someone would reach out to shake the hand, they would look at someone else. The greetings were largely empty, and little genuine hospitality was extended. Although mixed numerically and musically, the races clearly did not mix relationally. Something essential was missing.

Being given to hospitality, Kathie and I

After complimenting his message and ministry, we expressed our hearts' concern over the deficiency in hospitality and what day, the pastor addressed the congregation, calling them to hospitality and inquiring as to the experience of his members in opening their homes to one another. What happened was indeed shocking to pastor and people alike. One by one, people stood and lamented that no one had ever had them into their home. White folk were troubled that they had never been in the homes of their black brothers and sisters. Black folk complained that they had never been invited to break bread in a "white" home. They were in covenant with God but not in community with one another.

They were strangers in a large congregation with little fellowship, strangers in the "commonwealth of faith."

This reveals a heart condition increasingly characteristic of our culture. The roots are much deeper and more widespread than one might think.

> HABITS OF THE HEART

America grew and prospered after her Revolution for Independence. Fueled by the spirit of liberty and trusting in God's guidance, her abundance dwarfed her need. Hers was an open heart. As her citizens rejoiced in plenty, she opened her doors to the world. And the world came knocking. Never had there been such an expression of hospitality from a nation to the world. "Give us your tired, your poor, your huddled masses yearning to breathe free," wrote Emma Lazarus. There is "an open door." As a Jew, she had experienced America's extraordinary open heart to the stranger.

The spirit of liberty had bound us together. Blessing flowed. But gradually a mutant form of liberty began to emerge. It grew. Having not been recognized for its deadly nature, its roots were not pulled up. It went to seed and multiplied. America became

proud. And the Spirit of the Lord in the land yielded ground to another spirit—the spirit of men and women exulting in their new independence.

Independence took on new meaning. No longer seeking freedom from political oppression, independence began to claim freedom from personal responsibility to fellow citizens. This mutant form of independence spread rapidly across the land, went to seed, and mutated again, producing a wayward child named "Individualism." Individualism took on an identity of its own. Its resemblance to the grandparent brought acceptance to the heart of the nation. A generation arose that knew not the nature of liberty and independence as conceived in the hearts of our fathers.

Many people noted that Americans were fiercely independent. But it was really individualism that had taken hold. It was the new "right" to "be my own man, "to "do it my way" without regard to others. Secular "sociologist" and political observer, Alexis de Tocqueville, came from France to America in 1830 to discover what made America great. Lurking in the shadows of our prosperity, he discovered a dangerous "habit of our hearts." To describe it, he coined the term INDIVIDUALISM. He warned in Democracy in America that unless this twisted form of liberty were brought under control, it would jeopardize the very future of the Republic and destroy


Writing in their bestseller, Habits of the Heart (1985), sociologists Robert Bellah et al., discuss de Tocqueville's observations at great length, describing this "habit of the heart."

"Individualism is a calm and considered feeling which disposes each citizen to isolate himself from the mass of his fellows and withdraw into the circle of family and friends; with this little society





#### ALIENATED FROM THE WHOLE

Things produce after their kind, and individualism has proved to be no exception. Openness of heart prompting open hands and open homes of hospitality began to disappear from common practice.

In their revealing study *The Day America Told the Truth*, advertising executives Patterson and Kim, describe the ultimate consequences of America's embracing the cult of individualism. These findings sound a warning to pastor and people alike.

"Americans are disengaging their personal futures from our national destiny. Most Americans think that their own futures will be fine and dandy. They have become so alienated from the whole that they think they will be individually immune from the fate that they believe will befall the nation as a whole."

Virtually every social problem that plagues America today can be traced, in whole or in part, to the perversion of liberty known as individualism. Illegitimacy, divorce and broken families, AIDS, violent crime, abortion-the highest rates in the industrialized world-are all traceable to individualism. Our "culture of violence" is due to "violent individualism." Spiritually speaking we might call it "raw selfishness." That something has happened in the Habits of the Heart is no longer a matter of debate. "Viewed From Right or Left, Cultural Trend Lines are Alarming," declared an editorial headline. The writer admits, "Because the facts of social disintegration are. . . . so staggering, this is no longer a matter of ideological argument." He concludes, "It is no longer possible to pretend that the values by which people live their lives don't matter."

#### HOPE FOR HEALING

"Are You Prepared For What the Future May Hold?" That is the question heading pollster George Gallup's final chapter in Forecast 2000. They are words of warning from one of America's most respected researchers of the life of our nation. Gallup minces no words: "We now face serious dangers that threaten our future and per-

haps our very existence as a nation."

We are hurting and we know it. America's heart is broken. We need a message of genuine hope and healing. We need a prescription designed by the Creator Himself for the very problems that ail us. We need *The POWER of Hospitality*.

The POWER of Hospitality will change your life, your family, your church... yes, even our nation and world if you will let it. It is hidden power for those who will dare to practice it. It is divine power that flows from an open heart, an open hand and open home.

#### A DIVINE MANDATE
