U.S. Abortion Statistics - In Summary

Since the infamous Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision of 1973, America has experienced a self-inflicted holocaust of mind-bending and heart-rending proportions. This is the current portrait of 44 years of a self-indulgent "death" culture marketed in the name of "choice" and "life fulfillment."

- Total Abortions 58,586,256 over 44 years.
- Total Abortions Approximately 49 times the total number of all Americans killed in all of our wars from the Revolutionary War (1776) to the War on Terror (2016).
- Total Abortions 3,648 per day for 44 years.
- Approximately 20+% of all U.S. pregnancies end in abortion.

Closer Statistical Analysis (As of 2012 - Last Date of Available Stats)

- 40% of women who have abortions had no other children.
- 45% who have abortions have had at least one previously.
- 83% who have abortions in the U.S. are unmarried. Women who have never been married account for one-third.
- More than half of abortions are on women 25 and over.
- Nearly 80% of abortions are surgical.
- More than 20% of abortions are chemical.
- At current reduced rates, 1/3 of American women will have an abortion by age 45.
- About half of all pregnancies in U.S. are unintended. Of all unintended pregnancies, 4 in 10 are aborted.
- About 12% of U.S. abortions occur in teenagers.

Abortion By Race

- 49.7% of all black children are aborted.
- Blacks comprise only 13% of U.S. population but account for 37% of all abortions.
- Black women are 5 times more likely to abort than white women.

- Planned Parenthood, the largest seller of abortions, has located 80% of abortion clinics in minority neighborhoods.
- New York has become the "abortion capital." 42.4% of abortions are of black children–31% of Hispanic.

Decline in Abortion Rates

NOTE: All of the statistics in this report reflect the pattern of reduced abortion rates since 1990.

- After reaching a high of over 1.6 million in 1990, the number of annual U.S. abortions has dropped to around 1 million+ per year.
- Abortions for California and New Hampshire have not been reported to the CDC since 1998, and California produces the largest number of abortions every year by far.
- Theories abound to explain the gradual reduction in the abortion rates. Some claim greater access to or use of contraception. Others claim sex education. Many claim stricter laws. But the greatest influence seems to be "the change in perception-the ways in which the hearts and minds of young women and young men have changed about the reality and humanity of the unborn child." "The millennial generation knows that a pregnancy involves a living child because they have seen that child in an ultrasound image." (Charmaine Yoest President, Americans United for Life).
